Started with New Year's Prayer- Melissa

Guest Speaker-Mr. Furlong RE: Musical Instruments

We have asked for information about getting school instruments. Last year Mr. Furlong got a grant for another school of \$5000- he bought instrument through Long & McQuade, other sources possible (Empire). It may be possible to get extra support from other sources (ukuleles in particular). Mr. Furlong runs a ukulele club at lunch at another school (St. Augustine's).

Ideas of what to get and approximate prices:

Drums (Djembe)-\$65-81, useful for drama/dance too (Congas a possibility)

Doumbeks- Middle Eastern Instrument that would be of use

Ukuleles- \$85, good for teaching melody/theory, need tuners (\$16.50)- may be able to get it thrown in for free

Xylophones- \$300

Guitar?

These are good instruments to tie in with the program.

If we spend a certain amount- they usually throw in some extras.

Ukuleles or Drums- Class set (30-31 pieces)- \$2200 +tax

Want to ask him in the future: Where did he get the grant??

Guest Speaker: Mr. Scott Innes RE:Ward 1 Improvement Plan

Area rating money (\$3 million this year) provided in the budget- residents of our ward decide where it goes. In March you submit your ideas online (he will send us the link) or can do it on paper (Dropbox at Westdale Library or Emerson St Barber). In May you vote online for the idea you like best.

Must be a permanent improvement (or lead to a permanent improvement) and must be publicly accessible.

<u>Examples Given</u>: G.R. Allan- got a playground, public safety issues (flashing sign) or build a building for refugees

What we can do: Send out literature to parents/ families for ideas. Can get students involved-brainstorm ideas, essay contest. Can submit from kids.

Questions:

Where can you vote from? Ward one postal code necessary (ideas can come from anyone) How many ideas can we put in? As many as you want

Who oversees the administrative part? The committee does all of that

Where do the funds go? Hope to go to each area of Ward One (Ainslie Wood area is ours - 403 to Dundas, Main to Mountain)

How many projects approved? 10-15 in past- could even be for 1/2million (they have engineers to cost it out), can even be a down payment on a larger project.

All Members are asked to put some thought into potential projects for the Area Rating Grants and come to the February meeting with these ideas for discussion, prioritization and action plans/next steps.

Learning with Faith Goal

This is a Parent resource- from it you can print out extra resources and it provides advice on how to teach math concepts. 6 copies will be in the library that can be checked out.

- 13. Tell Them From Me Climate Survey Results: Students, Parents, Staff
- **Grade 4-8 students** (85 of 95 students participated = 89% of students) two separate attachments one is on bullying & Safe Schools alone
- **Staff** (11 staff members, 100% of teaching staff)
- **Parents** 31 of 127 families participated, 24% of families

Overall, I am pleased with the results. Yes, there are some areas of concern which require attention and action. Always room for improvement. This survey aligns clearly with our SIPSA -5^{th} Pillar Goal, which I look forward in discussing with Staff at our monthly divisional meetings and SIPSA release days.

Student highlights include:

- 82% of students in the school have a high sense of belonging
- 80% of students have positive relationships
- 26% of students in this school have moderate to high levels of anxiety (35% girls and 18% boys), Canadian norm is 16%
- 51% of students reported being a victim of bullying for at least one of the 4 types of bullying (physical, verbal, social, cyber – social and verbal ranked highest)
- 64% of bullying takes place during recess
- 38% of students in this school were victims of moderate to severe bullying in the previous month, Canadian norm 26%
- 64% of students felt safe attending school, Canadian norm is 68%
- Students rated advocacy at school 7 out of 10 (who feel they have someone at school who consistently provides encouragement and can turn to advice), Canadian norm is 4.9
- Positive teacher-student relations were rated 8.2 out of 10. Canadian norm 7.9
- Students rated disciplinary climate of the classroom 6.6 out of 10, Canadian norm 7.4
- Students rated teachers' expectations for academic success 8.7 out of 10, Canadian norm 8.7
- 74% of students "heard about Restorative Justice"

Worrisome Results: Bullying/not feeling safe (discussed how perhaps there was a misinterpretation of Bullying), high levels of anxiety Good results: belonging and having good relationships, positive teacher/student relations, expectations

for success

We do many events at the school to help deal with these issues: Kindness club, Spring-Kindness daydance/yoga, Mac 3rd year Nurses, other clubs etc...

As you are well aware, at Canadian Martyrs we continue to promote a kind and caring community. Some initiatives/examples include:

Fundraising:

Valentine's Day Cake Raffle:
